FREE HIV & STD TESTING

Serving as a critical part of Southern Nevada Health District's testing and counseling programs, The Center offers complimentary rapid HIV testing and counseling as well as syphilis and hepatitis C* testing to Nevada residents. The goal is to empower people with an awareness of their own situations and allow them to take control of their lives. The current testing schedule is listed below.

MONDAY-THURSDAY 10:30AM-12:30PM & 1:30-5PM

Free Rapid HIV Testing (results in 20 minutes)
Free Syphilis Testing (results in 10-14 days)
Free Hepatitis C Testing (results in 10-14 days)*

FIRST SATURDAY OF EACH MONTH 10:00AM-3:00PM

(2ND SATURDAY IN CASE OF HOLIDAY)

Free Rapid HIV Testing (results in 20 minutes)
Free Syphilis Testing (results in 10-14 days)
Free Hepatitis C Testing (results in 10-14 days)*

**Hepatitis C testing is available only for those who meet certain criteria, such as being an intravenous drug user or dating one. Please call The Center for further details.*

PRE-EXPOSURE PROPHYLAXIS

Taking PrEP every day can protect you from becoming infected with HIV. PrEP is taking the HIV pill Truvada every day in case of an exposure to HIV.



- Highly protective, FDA-approved, recommended by the CDC.
- Talk to your health provider.
- Start if and when you're ready.
- Get tested for HIV and STDs regularly. See health provider for regular check-ups.
- PrEP does not prevent STDs or pregnancy.
- You may have to tell your provider about PrEP: www.cdc.gov/hiv/pdf/PrEPguidelines2014.pdf; Clinician PrEPline: 855-448-7737.
- Insurance, Medicaid and patient assistance programs (www.truvada.com/truvada-patient-assistance) can help cover costs.

If you answer "yes" to any of the questions below, PrEP may be right for you.

- Do you use condoms sometimes or not at all?
- Do you "bottom" without a condom?
- Is your sexual partner(s) HIV-positive or an unknown status?
- Have you been on PEP in the past year?
- Have you used PEP before more than once?
- Have you been treated recently for an STD, such as rectal gonorrhea?
- Are you trying to get pregnant with an HIV-positive partner?
- Do you/your sex partner(s) use or inject drugs?
- Do you/your sex partner(s) exchange sex for money, housing, drugs or other needs?
- Has your partner threatened or forced you to have sex against your will?
