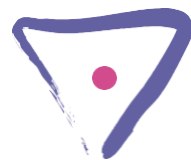

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FREE HIV & STD TESTING

Serving as a critical part of Southern Nevada Health District's testing and counseling programs, The Center offers complimentary rapid HIV testing and counseling as well as syphilis and hepatitis C* testing to Nevada residents. The goal is to empower people with an awareness of their own situations and allow them to take control of their lives. The current testing schedule is listed below.

MONDAY–THURSDAY 10:30AM–12:00PM & 1:30–5PM

- Free Rapid HIV Testing (results in 20 minutes)
- Free Syphilis Testing (results in 10–14 days)
- Free Hepatitis C Testing (results in 20 minutes)*

**Hepatitis C testing is available only for those who meet certain criteria, such as being an intravenous drug user or dating one. Please call The Center for further details.*

Please note the following restrictions and requirements:

- Clients CANNOT test for HIV at the Sexual Health Clinic then go to The Center's Wellness Clinic for a rapid HIV test. The system will flag that they have already been to the Decatur location and they will be denied testing.
- You must be a local resident or working in Southern Nevada with a Nevada ID, or health card, or TAM card, or student ID.
- We cannot accept out of state ID's, unless you can show proof of residency, insurance card, utility bill, lease agreement, or copy of paycheck with address.
- Testing and treatment is available to anyone 13 years of age or older.

ALL for ONE! – Making Positive Connections

Become a part of an invaluable support system and learn to thrive! Come connect with other individuals to support each other along your journey. Share your stories of struggle, courage, triumph, heartbreak, disappoint, and success as you learn to live a positive life.

All for One offers a safe space for sharing information and resources. All for ONE is open to individuals recently diagnosed with HIV and Long-term Survivors.

The group meets every Tuesday at 6pm.

PRE-EXPOSURE PROPHYLAXIS

Pre-exposure prophylaxis, or PrEP, is a way for people who do not have HIV but who are at substantial risk of getting it to prevent HIV infection by taking a pill every day. The pill (brand name Truvada) contains two medicines (tenofovir and emtricitabine) that are used in combination with other medicines to treat HIV. When taken consistently, PrEP has been shown to reduce the risk of HIV infection in people who are at high risk by up to 92%. PrEP is much less effective if it is not taken consistently.



POST-EXPOSURE PROPHYLAXIS

PEP (post-exposure prophylaxis) means taking antiretroviral medicines (ART) after being potentially exposed to HIV to prevent becoming infected. PEP should be used only in emergency situations and must be started within 72 hours after a recent possible exposure to HIV.
